Laura has conducted investigations for both private-sector clients and local government bodies, and in both unionized and non-unionized environments, and has investigated allegations regarding the conduct of employees, elected officials, and members of the public.

Laura has extensive experience drafting employment and consulting contracts, workplace policies and other employment related documents; providing strategic advice on a wide variety of workplace issues including employee hires and terminations, employment standards issues, employee disability and accommodation, collective agreement interpretation, and privacy matters; and litigating wrongful dismissal actions, human rights complaints and union grievances.
