She represented Osgoode at the Court of Appeal for Ontario for the 2023 Cassels Cup (Baby Gale), where she was the second place oralist and a member of the second-place respondent team.

She recently completed a clinical placement at the Human Rights Legal Support Centre, where she assisted applicants at the Ontario Human Rights Tribunal with mediations, hearings, and requests for orders.

Eyitayo obtained a Bachelor of Arts in History from McGill University in 2022, with First Class Honours and a specialization in legal history. At McGill, she served as editor-in-chief of the McGill Journal of Political Studies and led a youth advocacy non-profit organization in consultative status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council. She also interned at various international organizations focused on advancing girls' education through public-private partnerships in Sub-Saharan Africa.
